**Outstanding results for the last 20 years on the External Law programme**

Advance Tertiary College [ATC] has been providing individuals interested in a legal education with the opportunity not only to do the pathways leading to a law degree and a legal career, but it has also served as a platform of excellence in law for its students in that time.

According to Dr Danny Choong, Principal and Deputy CEO, "Our results each year are truly outstanding. The last ten years in particular have seen our University of London Bachelor of Laws degree students attain the largest number of second class upper honours degrees in the world. We are also the only private institution in the world with the highest number of First Class students on this programme".

In addition, the University of London awards the Malaysian Law Scholarships to King's College London every year to the top student for the Intermediate or first year of the law degree. ATC students have received this award eleven out of the fourteen times since it started.

Dr Choong had this to say, "It is about consistency in performance. The award goes to the top applicant in Malaysia and provides a wonderful opportunity for the student to excel internationally. More than half of our students who attained this award went on to obtain Second Class Upper degrees from King's College and many of them attribute their incredible success to the solid foundation laid at ATC".

For an institution that started with a mere 27 students in 1987, ATC has proved its mettle on the world platform and is recognized as the single largest private provider of the University of London Bachelor of Laws programme in the world.

Dr Choong commented, "With our centres in Kuala Lumpur, Penang, Singapore and Hong Kong (where we have two centres) we are able to provide more than 3000 students with support on the London programme. I believe it is the system of teaching, learning and support provided to each individual student that is a testament to quality".

ATC commences its intake final intake for the year on the London external on the weekend of 6<sup>th</sup> September and will be accepting enrolments until then.

Dr Choong said, "The response this year has been tremendous. We have been receiving continuous inquiries and we have already allocated funds for a large number of scholarships to deserving students – both from ATC and outside ATC. This year, as always, all our Part 2 students who do well in terms of their total score will receive some form of scholarship to pursue their CLP with us. During this period alone, we expect to give out more than RM150,000 in scholarships to the CLP students and about RM250,000 worth of scholarships to other deserving students".

He went on, "Our results each year have demonstrated that even students who attain one B+ in their second year can, with ATC's support, obtain a Second Class Upper Honours degree. I think it also has to do with the fact that we offer options that are not commonly available elsewhere such as Criminology, Conflict of Laws and European Union Law. For students intending to do the Bar Vocational Examinations in the United Kingdom, the EU Law option is compulsory."

The icing on the cake for this institution was to be selected as one of six institutions in the world to be awarded the Best Institutions Award by the University of London in conjunction with its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Dr Choong said, "This is truly an honour. We are the only private law school in the world that has been granted this honour and for us it is a badge of the level of excellence our students can expect to attain with us".
